He is survived by his wife Julia, three children and their spouses, Jeff and Donna Wilson, Alana and Ken Juneau, and Shannon and Jeff Fritschi. He was also blessed as a grandad to seven grandchildren, Savannah, Kyle and Cydney Wilson, Tony and Carol Juneau and Clayton and Tanner Fritschi.

“ Doug was a very special friend. I have so many memories, but the following is one of my favorites. On April 12, 1981, I was with Doug and Julia watching as Tom Watson won the green jacket at the Masters Golf Tournament in Augusta, Georgia. I had been invited by Doug to come to Atlanta on Saturday, drive with him to Augusta, and attend the final day of the Masters on Sunday. Doug told me that he had two tickets. I was surprised when Doug picked me up at the Atlanta airport because Julia was with him. I surmised that she had just come along to say hello, and that we would drop her off before proceeding to Augusta. That did not happen. As we drove to Augusta, I kept remembering Doug saying that he had two tickets. I had read an article in the airplane magazine on the way to Atlanta that told how impossible it was to get tickets to the Masters. People literally left Masters tickets in their wills. Sure enough, when we reached the motel Doug announced they would have to find another ticket. He asked the hotel manager where the "action" was. According to the manager, all the "action" was at private parties. He suggested that there might be some activity at the bar at the top of the Embassy Towers. Upon going there, Doug, Julia and I only found three other people sitting at a booth. Doug went over to the booth, introduced himself, sat down and started talking. After about 15 minutes, Doug returned to the table where Julia and I were having a drink and threw down a ticket to the Masters. He had convinced one of the three people that I needed the ticket more than she did. Doug was a great salesman. Incidentally, when we all slept in the same double bed that night, Doug insisted on sleeping in the middle.
