Emil Joseph Walcek, 70, of Roswell passed away on March 6, 2019 from injuries sustained in a cycling collision with a car. He was born on October 21, 1948, in South Bend, IN, to Emil and Kathleen Walcek. He grew up in Tujunga, Los Angeles, CA, where he met and wed Janice Dawne Walcek (née Wood) in 1969. They moved to Atlanta in 1972. After holding a series of jobs in marketing, advertising, and print, always the free spirit, Emil started his own company, EJW Associates Inc., in 1982, which remains a family business. Emil was a devoted family man, community-activist, thinker, writer, artist, and mountain biker; he was an active member of the local biking community. Emil will be remembered for his passion for life, his infectious smile, and for tirelessly helping others.
