Survived by her 3 children: Charles Preston Duckett and wife Mary, Michael (Mike) Duckett and Diane Duckett Gentry, her 3 granddaughters: Haley A. Duckett, Leah Gentry and Emily Simpson and husband Mark and 3 great grandchildren. Joyce is also survived by nine nieces and nephews.

Upon her retirement with Jimmy they built their retirement home on Lake Arrowhead and began the next life journey with old friends and new friends and a new community. The relaxed atmosphere far away but not too far from their roots in the Atlanta area suited them well. All of these plans were laid in action and then suddenly interrupted when Jimmy passed way too soon in May 1989.

Joyce's life was centered around all of her family and fortified by her profound faith and love for Christ and Family and Friends. If Joyce called you as friend then you were cherished by her for all of her long blessed life.

Her Christian faith journey began early in life and continued throughout life as she
