



## Mr. Alex Robert Chrzanowski

Mr. Alex Chrzanowski, (Chooch) age 48, of Roswell, Georgia passed away Sunday, August 28, 2022. Alex was born on July 1, 1974 in Rochester, New York, the son of Thomas Chrzanowski and the late Jean Ann Chrzanowski. Alex moved to the Atlanta area at the age of 22 where he began his 26-year teaching career at Roswell High School including teacher of the year in 2004. Alex held an undergraduate degree, master's degree and Education leadership degree.

Alex had a knack for connecting with people and touched thousands of lives. He knew how to motivate people and encouraged them to go above and beyond what even they believed was achievable.

An avid lover of travel and thirst for new experiences, Alex spent many months and SkyMiles traveling the world and always had another trip planned around the corner. He also loved organizing and chaperoning trips for students whether it was to North Carolina skiing or 2-week stints all over Europe.

Alex was actively involved in coaching sports at Roswell High School including soccer and lacrosse. The culmination of his coaching career resulted in two state lacrosse championships.

Alex is preceded in death by his beloved mother, Jean Ann Chrzanowski. He is survived by his sister, Lynne Ann Daly (Richard); his nieces, Katelyn and Ava of Pensacola, Florida; his father; Thomas Alexander Chrzanowski and his wife Elisabeth of Penfield, New York as well as her children, Debbie and

Peter. Alex also held a very special place in his heart for his many aunts, uncles, and cousins and too many friends to count. But most importantly, he is most lovingly survived by his dog, Finn.
