On December 15, 2020, a real one was taken from us too soon at the age of 17. Alexander Escabi was born on October 26, 2003 and graced the town of Milton, Georgia as a young child with all his humor and love.

As a rambunctious child and teenager, Alex was never shy and saw the good in just about every single person he met. He approached strangers and connected energetically with those in need of comfort or a smile, and placed their needs above his own. He was loved by many and many loved him. It is not easy to find a soul like Alex's and the charisma that existed within him could only exist upon birth. Whatever spark we tend to look for in meaningful relationships, he lit it with ease.

Though he loved his community here in Georgia, he dreamed of the city that never sleeps and counted down the days till he was able to move to New York and study to become a hot shot lawyer or badass FBI Agent. To prepare for the transition, he worked hard to save his earnings and studied hard to ace his classes, even taking Arabic.

Alex is survived by his mother, Anabel, his father, Alexander, his step-father, Jacmel, and siblings, Crystal, Lia, Jahir, and Christian, Alex's family extended to friends from Cambridge High School, Jiu Jitsu sparring partners, co-workers from La Parrilla Mexican Restaurant, neighbors from the Milton

community, and even beyond the state's borders.

Though he is gone from this physical realm, Alex managed to win the hearts of those he touched and that is where he will remain. Never hiding who he was, Alex was in truth, and as an ode to his favorite artist Anuel AA, real hasta la muerte.
