Alexander Robertson Beard was born January 3, 1927 in Staunton, VA at the historic Stuart

House where six generations of his family lived. His family home was built in 1791. He was the son of Mary Stuart (Robertson) and William Kelly Beard. He attended Germantown Academy in Philadelphia as a boy, along with cousins and his brother, John Shepard. The Beard family recently held a large family reunion at the Academy where they proudly toured the new Beard Center for Innovation, which is part of the school's ongoing pursuit of excellence in education. Sandy, as he was known by many friends, was a graduate of Saint Andrew's School in Delaware and The University of Virginia. His father served in the Navy, his brother in the Army and Sandy in the Marines. He and his wife Margaret (Peggy, predeceased) wed in 1956 and raised their three children, Margaretta Lee (Svedres), Alexander Robertson Beard, Jr and Mary Stuart (Neill) in Saint David's, PA and had four grandchildren. He and Peggy retired to

Cumming, GA to be closer to Mary Stuart and her family. Sandy was regarded as a true
