



## Dr. Amos Joseph St. Germain

May 29, 1947 - September 17, 2021

Dr. Amos J. St. Germain passed away on Friday September 17 at home in Roswell, GA. He was born in 1947 in New York, NY.

Dr. St. Germain is survived by his wife, Susan Ahrendt St. Germain; his sons, David and Matthew (Diana); his daughter, Adrienne Tetreault (Joel); and granddaughters, Natalie and Maren Tetreault. He was preceded in death by his parents; Herbert and Mary (Newman) St. Germain; and his sister, Jean. Amos obtained his bachelor's degree in History from Fordham University, his master's degree in American Studies from Purdue University, and Ph.D. in American Civilization from the University of Iowa. Amos taught at Southern Technical Institute in Marietta, GA from 1947-1986 where he was awarded Outstanding Faculty Member numerous times. He went on to teach at Wentworth Institute of Technology in Boston, MA from 1986 – 2015. While at WIT he was the Department Head of Humanities, Social Sciences, and Management for 10 years, Transfer of Credit Officer for 6 years, and Member of the Athletic Board for 29 years. He received the Distinguished Service Award and the Gold Leopard Award during his tenure. He wrote numerous academic articles and edited textbook in his long career as an educator. Amos was also active with the Boy Scouts of America and received the Veteran Service Award for his 25 year contribution of service to the organization. Amos was a Eucharistic Minister for 25 years.

Amos was a parishioner at St. Peter Chanel Church in Roswell, GA. His service will take place at the church on Friday, October 15, 2021 at 2PM. The

family will receive friends on Thursday October 14, 2021 between 4pm and 6pm at Northside Chapel Funeral Directors, Roswell, GA.
