Andrew Parks Black, 95, a native of Atlanta, died August 5, 2016. He is predeceased by his wife, Frances Richardson Black.

A.P. served in the 35th Infantry during WWII, earning two Purple Hearts during the invasion of France. He joined the City of Atlanta Fire Department in 1947 and retired in 1979 as Director of Fire Services. A.P. was a devoted husband, father and grandfather. A true gentleman.
