Anthony (Tony) Vergouven was born in Kansas City, Kansas on March 11, 1949. He grew up in Freeman, Missouri with his mother, Mary Wade Vergouven, his father, William “Bill” Vergouven and his two brothers, Billy and Doug Vergouven. He graduated from Cass County High School, and went on to Fort Scott College then on to the UMKC. During the Vietnam War era, he decided to enlist in the Air Force Reserves and was honorably discharged. Shortly thereafter, he traveled and lived in many cities, including Chicago, San Francisco, St. Louis, and Houston before settling in Atlanta with his wife and family. He built his business from the ground up as an entrepreneur and industrial designer which produced numerous iconic Atlanta landmarks. He is preceded in death by his mother, Mary, and his father, Bill. He is survived by his brothers Billy (Carol) and Doug (Kari), former wife, Dianne Bramlett Vergouven, his daughter Dr. Lauren Vergouven Brown (Alan), son Lane Daniel Vergouven and daughter Brynn Myra Vergouven. He is also survived by his two grandchildren Olivia (Lane) and Daniel (Lauren and Alan) and beloved nieces and nephews. His love of life, family and friends will forever be felt and missed by all who knew him.
