



## Apolonia Ostrowski

March 12, 1924 - October 22, 2012

Apolonia Ostrowski of Roswell, Georgia, passed away at home on October 22, 2012, after an illness of several months. She was born in Wilno, Poland (now Vilnius, Lithuania) on March 12, 1924, daughter of the late Felix and Adela (Wojciechowski) Szwabowicz. As a teenager and young woman, she survived World War II as a slave laborer. After the war, she met and married Mieczyslaw Ostrowski. They immigrated to the US and settled in Providence, RI, where she worked in the jewelry and semi-conductor industries. In 1994, she and her husband moved to Atlanta to be with their daughter, Elizabeth Ostrowski. They were married for 52 years. Her husband and her son, Christopher Ostrowski, predeceased her, as did her sisters Frances Szwabowicz and Stephanie Sokolowski. She is survived by her daughter, with whom she lived, and her two adoring animals, Caesar and Kleo. Also, surviving in Poland are niece, Krystyna Albaum, and nephews Michael Sokolowski and Janek Sokolowski. All are welcome at the Funeral Mass, which will be held on Friday, October 26, 2012, 10:00 A.M. at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church, 535 Rucker Rd., Alpharetta, GA, 30004. There will be no viewing and burial services will be private.
