Brad Zettler, of Milton, GA, passed away on June 7th, 2021 at age 47, after a courageous battle with Ocular Melanoma.

He was vivacious, fun loving and kind and the heart and soul of the many communities he touched. As the Touchdown Club President, he was a permanent fixture in the football program. He pushed others to be better humans simply by his extraordinary example on and off the field and was a man of integrity. Brad was the proprietor of Icebox Cryotherapy in Alpharetta and Woodstock and a previous employee of Takeda Pharmaceuticals.

Originally from Flower Mound, Texas, he was the only child of Bobby and Shirley Zettler. He graduated from Southwest Texas State University. He is

survived by his loving wife, Dana, his two remarkable sons, Blake and Brayden, and his loving parents, Bobby and Shirley Zettler.
