



Brannon Roberts

April 22, 1945 - July 18, 2006

ROBERTS - Brannon Roberts, 61, of Alpharetta, died July 18 while on vacation in New Hampshire with his wife Linda. He was born in Atlanta, grew up in Sylvan Hills, and graduated from Sylvan High School and from Shorter College, where he was president of the student body. He taught choral music at Bass High School, Ridgeview High School, and Milton High School, and also served as minister of music at Roswell United Methodist Church. In 1977 he came to Alpharetta First United Methodist Church as Director of Music Ministries, beginning with one small adult choir and building a legacy of a large adult choir, a contemporary group, a senior citizens choir, two women's ensembles, an accomplished adult bell choir, a full-fledged children's music program, and an instrumental program. He signed his e-mails "The Village Songleader"--an example of his unflinching sense of humor. Because he loved music and loved to have fun while practicing and rehearsing, people cherished working with him--and he made each person feel special. He had a unique gift for choosing music that captured the choir's interest, was appropriately challenging, and inspired the congregation during worship. Brannon loved Shaker furniture, a lush garden, a satisfying meal (especially lobster), a well-performed, beautiful piece of music, and fellowship with friends. He is survived by his beloved wife, Linda; stepsons, Nathan Almond (North Carolina) and Doug Almond (Georgia); sister, Pam Burke (Michigan); brother, Terry (New Jersey); and his adoring dachshund, Sadie. The funeral service celebrating his life and ministry will be at 11:00 a.m., Saturday, July

22, 2006, at Alpharetta First United Methodist Church, with Dr. Don Martin, Dr. Hal Brady, Dr. Harvey West and Dr. Joe Bowen officiating. Visitation will be Friday evening from 5 until 9 PM at Northside Chapel.
