



## Mr. Dan Loposer

July 9, 1925 - March 15, 2015

Dan Loposer, a Navy veteran, a computer scientist whose work at IBM aided America's exploration of space, and a professor who helped prepare a generation of Jackson State University students for careers in technology, died in Roswell on March 15. He was 89. Born in 1925, Dan was a native Mississippian who grew up in the hardship of the Depression. His father worked mostly in the lumber industry, though jobs were fleeting and the family moved frequently around Mississippi and Louisiana. . Partly home schooled by his mother, he finished high school in Brookhaven, Miss., and later graduated from Alabama Polytechnic Institute – now known as Auburn University – where he studied chemical engineering and physics, ran track and played flute and piccolo in the marching band. In 1947, he met Marjorie Cooper, the daughter of friends of his father. Their marriage the following year lasted 65 years, until her death in 2014. Dan, who had lived in Roswell since 2004, was a member of the Friendship Sunday School Class at Roswell United Methodist Church. A friendly, talkative, curious man, a voracious reader with myriad interests including photography, history, music, golf and especially other people, he is survived by a loving family: Two children, Tim Loposer of Tulsa, Okla., and Lynne Loposer Weber of Roswell; and three grandchildren, Erinn Loposer, Cooper Loposer and Jacob Weber. A graveside service will be held on Friday, March 20, at 12:30PM at Georgia National Cemetery in Canton. The family will receive friends on Friday from 9:30AM until 11AM at Northside Chapel Funeral Directors in Roswell. (770-645-1414 w
