DeLOYD HARRISON, 94, of Ball Ground, GA, formerly of Alpharetta, GA, passed away January 27, 2022. Loyd, as he was known, was born in Cairo, GA on July 21, 1927 to Lee Roy and Sadie Saville Harrison. After his stint in the US Army, he moved to Alpharetta, GA where he met his Wife and procured a job at the General Motors Doraville Plant.
