Edward Joseph Langan, of Roswell, Georgia died Thursday, December 26, 2013 from complications of Alzheimer's disease. He was born on March 10, 1936 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to James and Agnes Langan. Born second among five siblings, Ed developed a traditional sense of family values that would define his life.

From 1957 to 1959 Ed served in the United States Army, including 18 months in Orleans, France. Upon completion of his military service he enrolled in St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia. Ed enjoyed a successful 36- year career in sales management with Boston Gear, retiring in 1998. He was an avid golfer and youth sports coach, continuing to coach for years after his own sons had grown. If a dance floor and music were present, Ed was easy to find. While he missed his Northern roots, Ed was always grateful for all the south had to offer his family. He is survived by Katie Gallagher Langan, his loving wife of 52 years, and his four sons Edward JR (Marianne), Michael (Jane), Paul (Sharon), and Tim (Kim), as well as his 13 grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his brother Jim Langan, and survived by his siblings, Jack Langan, Eileen Calder, and Jayne Fowler.
