



Mr. Edward Paul Wolff

May 22, 1945 - August 17, 2022

Edward Paul Wolff, age 77, passed away peacefully at home exactly 24 hours after leaving the hospital. It was his dying wish to pass at home. Edward was born on May 22, 1945 in Maspeth, New York to Frederick Christian Wolff and Grace Wolff. Edward graduated in 1963 from Grover Cleveland High School in Ridgewood, New York. He received his Associates Degree from John Jay College of Criminal Justice and Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from New York Institute of Technology in 1977. Edward served 20 years in the New York City Police Department while assisting his father as a locksmith. After retiring from the police force, he worked as a welder and was part of the Iron Worker's Union. On June 7, 1970 he married Susan Anne Cirillo in Queens, New York and moved to Commack, New York to raise a family. In 1996, they moved to Woodstock, Georgia which became his final resting place. He was preceded in death by his brother Frederick (Freddie) Christian Wolff. He is survived by his wife Susan Anne Wolff, his children Edward John Wolff and Kristin Anne Wolff Gatoux and grandchildren Ava Marie Wolff, Harrison Edward Wolff, and Grace Anne Wolff Gatoux. He will tell you that his greatest accomplishment was the love he had for his wife, children, and grandchildren. There was nothing more that he wanted to do than to support and be with his family. Further, Edward was devoted to caring for his mother and brother throughout their lives and is to be commended on his empathy and service to humanity. 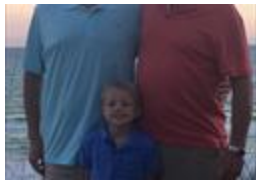
