



## Eleanor Pope

June 16, 1924 - July 31, 2012

Eleanor Elizabeth Pope, age 88, of Alpharetta, died July 31, 2012. She is survived by her daughter, Kathryn Pope Hoddeson of Alpharetta; sons David Lee Pope of Dallas, TX; Mark Andrew Pope of Lutz, FL; Douglas Edward Pope of St. Louis, MO; and Jeffrey Scott Pope of Arvada, CO. A large part of her legacy is 13 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. A funeral Mass will be held on Monday, August 13, 2012 at 10:30 AM at St. Brigid Catholic Church in Johns Creek, GA. A rosary & prayers will be said on Monday at 10:00 AM at the church. Interment will be held at Naples Memorial Gardens in Naples, FL on Wednesday, August 15, 2012 at 1:00 PM.

Eleanor E. "Mickey" Pope began her nursing career as a Nurse Cadet during World War II. While studying, she worked part-time jobs to make ends meet, and one of them was assembling US bombers for the war effort. She also worked as an assistant to one of the research scientists developing the atom bomb during WWII. After working for many years as a Registered Nurse, in addition to raising 5 children, she went back to school to obtain her Bachelors in Nursing from Purdue University, which she treasured deeply. Throughout her nursing career, she worked in Pediatrics, Obstetrical, and elderly care, until she retired at age 81.

Eleanor was preceded in entering the Kingdom of God by her husband, Thomas, after 42 years of marriage. Tom enlisted in the United States Army during WWII, and he utilized the GI Bill to earn an engineering degree from Carnegie Mellon University.
