George W. Lingefelt age 98 of Woodstock passed away peacefully at his home on August 11, 2021. He was born on February 27, 1923 in Silver City, Georgia to Wesley and Claudia Sexton Lingefelt. He graduated from Canton High School in 1941 and then was drafted into the Army. George served in the US Army during WWII in the Philippines, the South Pacific and was in the Occupation of Japan. By the end of his time in the Army he had risen to the rank of Sergeant. George was a member of the Optimist Club and active in the 4H Club in Hickory Flat. George was a barber for over 50 years at the City Barber Shop in Alpharetta. In 1963 George started Boy Scout Troop #465 in Hickory Flat and stayed active for the next 50 years. He earned the awards of Silver Beaver and Good Shephard. He was a part of the Order of the Arrow. George was a member of Rock Springs Baptist Church and for many years was the choir director. He taught gospel singing and theory at many churches. He was preceded in death by his wife, Nora Mae Kuykendall Lingefelt and daughter, Suzanne Hosea. He is survived by his son, Michael Lingefelt (Deborah West) ; grandson, Nathaniel G. Lingefelt, Charles W. Hosea, Jr.; great-grandchildren, Miranda Lunsford and Blaine Hosea; great-great-grandchildren, Briella Lunsford and Maddox Lunsford along with numerous nieces, nephews and extended family.
