Houston Tanksley “H.T.” Weaver, Jr., 67, of Roswell, Georgia, passed away Thursday, June 15, 2017 at Signature Healthcare of Buckhead.

H.T. was born March 17, 1950 in Knoxville, Tennessee to Houston, Sr. and Ruth Weaver. He later attended the University of Georgia where he was a member of Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternity and the Air Force ROTC. After graduating in 1972 he began his career as an Air Force Tactical Fighter Pilot in Clovis, New Mexico. After active duty he continued to serve his country in the Air Force Reserves before retiring as a Major with a total of twenty nine (29) years of service. While in the Reserves he worked full time in private banking. He was also active in the Boy Scouts of America. He achieved the high rank of Eagle Scout and was a member of the Order of the Arrow, and was a member of the East Cobb Rotary Club. In his free time he loved to run, woodwork, garden, and spend time with his wife and family.

H.T. is survived by his wife, Susan Weaver, his son Mark Weaver, his stepdaughters, Morgan Fretz and Jennifer Kleier, and six grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his infant son, Timothy, and his parents, Houston, Sr. and Ruth Weaver.
