He took the yogurt and soda, then he slid the sandwich and chips across his little table over to me. He said he only wanted the yogurt and he'd ordered the sandwich for me because I hadn't eaten lunch yet. I shared this because it's very typical of his character to be thoughtful, kind and considerate. Even in all the pain he was in along with the day he was having at the doctor he thought of me and that I might be hungry. I can only hope to be half as great a man as him someday.*
