Jodi Sue (Lee) Moore, age 65, passed away at her home in Roswell, GA on November 4, 2022 following a short but valiant fight with cancer. She was born June 10, 1957 in Owatonna, MN, raised in Sioux City, IA, and lived in Nashville for 33 years before moving to Roswell. She was preceded in death by her parents Robert F. and J. Clarine Lee.

Jodi is survived by her husband of 42 years Michael; daughter, Julie Kissane (TJ); grandson, Michael Kissane; sisters, Trudy Johannsen, Kristi Neerman (Robert), Mary Meacham (Jay); brother, Jon Lee (Colleen); mother-in-law, Sylvia Jackson; sister-in-law, Elizabeth Daniell (Fred); and many other family members.

She graduated from North High School (Sioux City) in 1975, and received her BA from Iowa State University in 1979. Jodi was a member of Delta Zeta sorority where she served as President during her senior year. She joined the Federal Reserve Bank in October 1987 and held various roles in sales and relationship management until her death.

Jodi's faith was strong. She was a member of Bellevue United Methodist (BUMC) for over 32 years, serving in numerous ways including nursery coordinator, staff-parish committee chair, and as a member of the hand bell choir. Jodi was also a regular platelet donor and a Tennessee Titans fan.

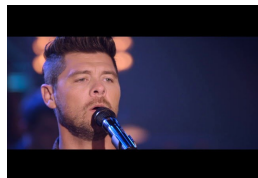
