It is with heavy hearts we announce the passing of John “Jack” Horn, Jr, who was called home to be with the Lord on March 5, 2025, at the age of 82. Jack was a beloved husband, father, grandfather, and friend, whose warmth, humor, and generosity touched all who knew him.

Jack was born to the late John Howard Horn and Jean Phillips Horn on May 30, 1942 in Louisville, Ky. Jack attended the University of Alabama on an academic and swimming scholarship, earning his bachelor’s degree in 1965 and his master’s in operations research with the UA Industrial Engineering Department in 1966.
