



Mr. Karippacheril Chacko Eapen

February 7, 1924 - July 30, 2017

K.C. Eapen, 93, died the evening of July 30, 2017 with family and friends at his side in Roswell, Georgia. He was the beloved husband of Melanie Ruggieri Eapen.

Eapen was born on February 7, 1924 in Kerala, India. He emigrated to the United States of America in 1953, and earned his Ph.D. in British Literature from the University of Colorado at Boulder.

K.C. Eapen became a U.S. Citizen in 1972. He taught at several colleges and universities, retiring from Clark Atlanta University in 1993 after teaching there for thirteen years. During his tenure at Clark Atlanta, he received major grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Government of Japan to advance cross-cultural literary studies, which included a variety of travels around the world.

At his request, the family held a private service at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church, 535 Rucker Rd, Alpharetta, GA 30004 United States, on August 2, 2017.
