



Mr. Kevin Paul Chojnacki

September 20, 1960 - September 13, 2022

It is with great sadness that we share Kevin Paul Chojnacki, 61, of Milton, Georgia, passed away peacefully on September 13 after a brief battle with an aggressive form of cholangiocarcinoma. As he handled life in general, Kevin courageously fought his illness, savoring each day with his family. His life story is one of resilience and pursuing excellence; his loved ones will continue to honor that strength and legacy by living their lives to the fullest.

Kevin was born and grew up in Stevens Point, Wisconsin. He was an athletic youth, running track and cross country, and later becoming a competitive cyclist. Kevin also had a soft side for wildlife, adopting Blacky, a mischievous crow, and Ringo and Bandit, the smooching raccoons. As an adult, he continued to regularly rescue critters in distress and take in abandoned animals. Undaunted, Kevin was also a lifelong, diehard Packers fan.

After graduating from the University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point, Kevin enjoyed a successful 30 year career as a sales executive with Sentry Insurance. Some of his best memories were of the Leaders trips he enjoyed with family and colleagues in a host of exotic venues such as Banff, Maui and

Aruba.

Mary and Kevin wed in 1998 and ultimately welcomed two beautiful children, Claire and Nicholas. They had many wonderful times together. Kevin had a passion for adventure and the outdoors, especially kayaking, hiking, fishing, boogie boarding, and snorkeling with his family. He and his children were expert Megalodon tooth hunters and relished sea kayaking amongst dolphin pods. Kevin travelled widely, enjoying vacations with his loving in-laws, including a recent Alaskan cruise with close orca encounters and king salmon charter fishing. Always a quick study, Kevin mastered London's eclectic tourist scene and driving on the 'wrong side' of the road in Ireland (with only minimal damage to the rental car).

Never meeting a project he couldn't tackle, Kevin was affectionately known as "MacGyver." He had remarkable problem-solving skills and could improvise just about anything – from unique pool solar heating units to retaining walls rivalling the Great Wall of China. It was exhausting just watching Kevin's kinetic pace as he pristinely maintained home and acreage, with energy to spare to help neighbors. He excelled at outsmarting squirrels and chipmunks. Despite the ravages of cancer, he ran 'property upkeep master classes' trying to convey some of his expertise to his earnest yet oblivious relatives.

Kevin is survived by his dotting wife of 24 years, Mary; children Nicholas, Claire, Dana (Andy) Buchanan, and Anthony (Tracy); parents Dorene and Gerald; siblings Perry (Jackie) and Lori (Tim) Epstein; grandchildren, Brooklyn, Reed and Addilyn; and his pups, Copper and Charlotte. He was particularly close to his parents-in-law, Robert and Mary Lou King, and his sister-in-law, Kathleen Buck and her husband, Mark, and their children, who helped immensely during his chronic illness. Kevin will be profoundly missed.

Rd, Roswell, Georgia from 1:00-3:00 on Saturday September 24, 2022, followed immediately at 3:00 by a Memorial Service to honor his life. “ It was both shocking and deeply saddening to hear of Kevin's passing, absolutely not the news that I could have expected at any time, let alone at what seems such an early time in life. I'd kind of lost track of Kevin in recent years, though I often told stories of times we shared growing up. I am thankful for those times, and sorry there will be no more. It has taken some time to come to terms with Kevin's passing, he was always the fastest, most agile kid in any of the groups we hung out with. It's difficult to comprehend the loss of such vitality.

We grew up together, running through woods and fields, day and night, looking for adventure, and yeah, sometimes a little trouble. Mostly, we tried to be good kids, and friends. We hunted and fished together, and ranged around like wild young animals--they were different times. We traveled to places near and far, on trips with family and friends. Memories from our childhood times and early years flash by now, like a slideshow, fleeting but always comforting and valued. Somewhere I have a photo of Kevin holding the biggest brook trout I ever saw on the end of a line in any stream or spring pond in central Wisconsin. I'll keep looking for it, and send a copy when I find it. There were afternoons stalking quietly after deer, following their trails and waiting quietly, sitting high up on an oak limb or beside a log, sometimes even following blood on the leaves, always working together to recover the animal. Kevin and I once spent almost 5 hours dragging a big buck out of the woods near the Little Wolf River, reaching a gravel road long after dark. We then stopped for a beer in the village of Rosholt on the way home. We were so tired I don't know that we ever finished our drinks, but we were proud of the scouting, the practice, the tracking, and finishing the job, and bringing that buck home.

Kevin had a competitive side, pushing hard as a partner in a couple of canoe races and a team triathlon, but his efforts and his focus were at their greatest in wild places. Paddling and camping in Ontario's Quetico Provincial Park, or messing around with canoes in springtime whitewater in central Wisconsin. Whether gathering wood for a campfire or pulling hard on a paddle in capped out waves, Kevin held a laser focus on the goal at hand. That's not to

say that he didn't save time and consideration for some good mischief. There were rocks and other things hidden in portage packs that Kevin would always offer to help hoist onto someone else's back. There were races on portage trails that usually led to a few knots on the top of somebody's head after a misstep launched a canoe out of balance.

Mostly, there were good times that helped lay the foundations for lifetime pursuits, in places that were wild, and places that were not so wild or exotic, but still woven into the fabric of a life well lived.

Miki, I know you, your children, and the rest of Kevin's family and friends are grieving a terrible loss, but I also know that we all have a multitude of memories of Kevin to carry with us, to call on for comfort and to lean on for the lessons they hold.

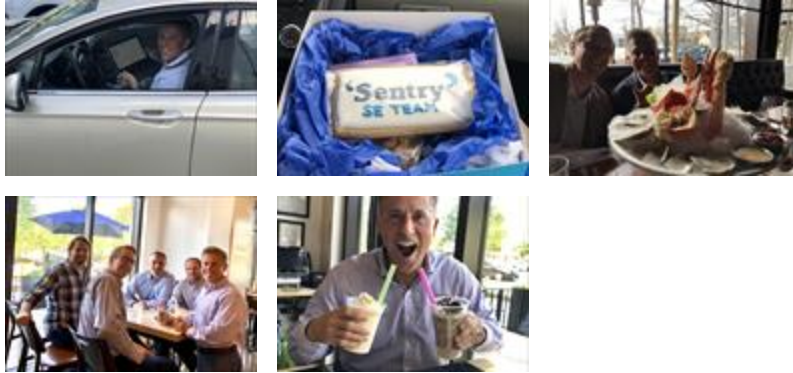
