January 31, 2004 - August 25, 2024

Maria Mitchell, age 20, of Roswell, Georgia, passed away on Sunday, August 25, 2024, in New Haven, Connecticut. Maria was born on January 31, 2004, in Atlanta, Georgia, and she was the beloved daughter of Christy and Joe Mitchell.

Maria spent her childhood in Roswell, attending Atlanta Academy, Elkins Pointe Middle School, and Roswell High School. She briefly resided in Tallahassee, Florida, before joining Turnbridge, a residential treatment program in Connecticut, in May 2023. After completing the program in July 2024, Maria was living in New Haven at the time of her passing.

Maria had an amazing, loving care team and sober network, yet she succumbed to the devastating mental health disease of addiction. For those that are struggling or already in recovery, her family prays you will embrace the support of professionals and your sober network now more than ever.

Maria was a nature lover from early childhood. Her mother affectionately called her "Bug" (Love Bug) without even realizing it. She rode horses for years, achieving national recognition in equestrian competitions.

Maria was also a gifted artist, particularly enjoying painting and ceramics. At age 13, she received a national award for her original artwork.

Maria had a soul that was both old and young at the same time, with a wisdom beyond her years. She possessed a childlike curiosity, a witty and whimsical sense of humor, and an incredibly gentle nature. Maria made everyone around her feel seen and loved. Her kindness radiated and was felt

by anyone blessed to have encountered her. Maria's influence will forever remain in the lives of all who knew and loved her. Her deep love for her family and friends will endure in our hearts, guiding us in this life and the next.

Preceded in death by her grandparents, Maria Bosley, Delores Bosley, and Joan and Joe Mitchell, all of Huntsville, Alabama, Maria is survived by her parents, Christy and Joe Mitchell of Miramar Beach, Florida; her grandfather, Jerry Bosley; her uncle, Mike Mitchell (wife Jenny); her aunt, Annette Payne Birchfield; her cousins, Davison Payne (wife Alli), Hayes Payne (wife Callie), and Anna Mitchell, all of Huntsville, Alabama; extended family in Miami, Florida, and Owensboro, Kentucky; and many friends and loved ones.

Maria's family is deeply grateful for the outpouring of love and support during this difficult time.

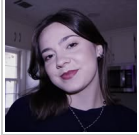

“ What I had to say the service about Maria:

It's my first day of school freshman year. I walk into My first period English class and take a seat. Behind me, I see a tall blonde pretty eyed girl and we get acquainted. That girl was maria Mitchell. And she became the first friend I ever made in high school. Instantly we hit it off, her radiance of joy and laughter was so striking, it felt impossible to not be friends with her. I mean 1 week in we already had an incident, where she threw hand sanitizer at me, and of course, I did the same, throwing it back at her, landing in her eye, and while I sat there feeling bad, she sprinted back in the room laughing and smiling saying "thanks Michael I get to go home". Shortly into my freshman year, I went through some dark stuff in my life. A situation happened with my friends at the time, and I felt quite alone. Even though she had known me for only a few weeks, Maria helped me out with it. Long nights on Facetime, no matter whether or not her mom took her phone, random hangouts after school, it was the little moments we had that made me feel so comforted. And in a time where I feared nothing more than being excluded, she made me feel included and confident. Her loyalty was unwavering. Being around Maria was like being in a forcefield of her love and kindness, feeling like absolutely nothing could pierce it from the outside. Never had I ever met a person so incapable of judgement, it might be the thing I admired about her the most. She didn't care who you were, what you had ever done, or if you were surrounded by demons, Maria would always, see the angel in you. Maria's forcefield had an atmosphere that was one of true carelessness, spontaneous, youthful fun. You know when you are on vacation, and you feel as if you must be doing something all day, making sure you have activities from sun up to sun down? That feeling, was one Maria would have on a Tuesday afternoon. Always finding something to do, no matter how simple or silly it was. Even from a young age she knew that life is not always all that serious. I look around today, and I expected nothing less than to see such a large amount of people gathered here. From the internet, I found that the average person knows about 600 people. But I'm in confident in

saying that Maria prolly knew 3x the amount. No matter where she went, Maria knew somebody, and if she didn't, they would quickly become friends. Touching so many people's hearts, living life with a spontaneous sense of fun that I hope all of us can incorporate into our own lives, Maria lived a heck of a life. And while her time may have been too short, I know so well, that she lived more than many people will live in their entire life. And while I wish I could have one more of her hugs, I have learned so much from Maria, and will feel the forcefield of her love and kindness in the my heart for the rest of my life. Thank you.

Good afternoon everyone, I'm Will Selby, I became friends with Maria in early high school and like a good amount of her friends here, we met at the neighborhood pool.

Didn't have this written but I think this is around the time when I said something along the lines of:
I actually have never been to a funeral before and haven't spoken in front of this many people since middle school graduation but here I am standing before you all, so I want to thank you all for listening to what I've got to say.

Last week, everybody here lost someone. Maybe she was a cousin, niece, daughter, a friend, a best friend.

Personally, I lost someone who just gets it. Someone who understood what it meant to be human, being the most accepting, empathetic, and non-judgemental soul.

When we would call each other while she was away in her programs, the way she spoke about life and the people around her was so positive, with such a creative and outside-the-box world view that just made you want to appreciate life and the people around you.

And I know that to some degree, every person in this room could understand the calming nature of her presence.

And even though it brings me much pain knowing that we've all lost someone, it brings solace to me to know that her battle is over.

So although we have all lost someone, I want to tell you about what I will take with me

a lesson that we can all take from Maria.

One thing she casually said to me a few times over the years was "I wish I was a cloud."

Although that sounds mundane, it always struck me to be profound because it spoke so much towards her character, and has stuck with me until today.

Floating by peacefully for everyone to admire, so free and uplifting it couldn't help but make you happy.

Just as clouds nourish the earth, she would nourish all the people around her with the refreshing feeling of just knowing it's all going to be alright.

Just like a cloud comes in many different forms, I witnessed her go through different parts of her life, and she adapted and fought through many ups and downs. But never stopped floating along and being a role model for positivity

Just like a cloud, she was always serene and calm. She wouldn't get caught up on the things that weren't in the bigger picture, nothing could stop her from floating along.

So when your everyday stresses of life get to you; let Maria help you to remember that you can take a day to just be a cloud.

“ *Maria Mitchell Eulogy*

I first want to thank everyone for being here today in person as well as those that are joining us live from the Stream.

Maria was my everything. Her genuine smile and the twinkle in her eye filled my heart. She was a burst of sunshine and she brought so much joy to those around her. Maria has been described as sweet, funny, kind, beautiful, talented and fearless. She had an old soul and was wise beyond her years, while also being young at heart and carrying herself with a childlike innocence and freeness. She was all of that and more.

We held a candlelight vigil last night with our family and closest friends. Several of them were also at the hospital the day Maria was born. Being with them reminded me of that day and that even at birth, Maria marched to her own drum as she kept us all waiting many...many... hours at the hospital to welcome her. She came when she was ready.

Friends closest to Maria over the years were also with us last night to share their memories of her and what she meant to them. Emma and Owen who were like a sister and brother to her and spent their earliest years together. They shared her love of imaginary play and the outdoors. Zohe, her best friend through elementary school shared how Maria convinced her to set up jumps in our back yard and pretend they were horses jumping a course. Also with us, were friends that first met Maria in middle and high school - some of who you will hear from today. What struck me most from all of their shares was a theme of love and acceptance. They saw Maria as original, quirky, free spirited and someone that loved and accepted everyone she met. She made others feel fully known, fully loved, and fully seen.

Maria packed more life in her 20 years than most do in a lifetime. Her imagination knew no bounds and she was always seeking an adventure. Maria loved sunrises and I know... she saw many. Her friends and I were laughing last night at all the ways they would sneak in and out of our house. They made it an adventure to try different doors and windows to perfect their system. Maria was creative and had a passion for all forms of music and art.

She was an avid lover of animals and nature. She would touch and curiously examine any living thing she encountered. I remember a time a frog had gotten into our house. Joe and I called for Maria to come take it out because neither of us wanted to touch it. She would carry a spider or insect outside if I wanted them removed from our home or she would say... "that's ok mom, they are not hurting anything" because she knew better than me that they too had a right to be there. She loved horses from the moment she first saw them. They challenged and comforted her all the same. Years ago she wrote that it was when she was riding that she could be her most authentic self.

Maria presented herself as tough, confident and fearless... and yet, she had a deep inner insecurity and fear of life. She was emotional and sensitive. She struggled with depression. She wrote that in her struggle with addiction- she could never fully trust herself. At her darkest times, she was sad and hopeless against her emotions and felt the only thing that seemed to help were drugs.

In her step work journal, she described herself as a highly vibrational person and that when she discovered drugs as a way to take away all of that energy, she instantly fell in love. She had an addictive personality for as long as she can remember - struggling with attachment issues, relationships with people, food and substances. She knew it hurt the people around her to see her go through these things and that there was nothing more they could do. She needed to help herself. She felt a void in her life that I am not sure we will ever fully understand. She knew her addiction was bad and that if she went out and used again she would probably die. I do not believe she wanted to die. She just let her fear get the best of her, dropped her guard on protecting her recovery and resorted to old familiar coping skills.

We almost lost Maria to this disease in April of 2023. By the grace of god, she survived another 15 months. These past months were challenging and at times difficult for her, and yet, she had some of the best experiences in her life and formed meaningful connections. She felt safe and secure and she was trying to find a healthy way to happiness and peace. She went rock climbing, hiking, skiing, surfing and camping. She played paintball. She planted a garden and found

joy in reviving neglected plants. She spent countless hours in the coffee shop and playing board games with friends. She enjoyed thrifting and exploring vintage shops. She was surrounded by a loving care team and peers that embraced her and accepted her like she did for so many. She also experienced a deep and authentic loving relationship that everyone should have in their lifetime.

Last fall Maria joined a sober softball league and met a young man named John. Maria loved him. In a letter to her, he wrote, "I love you to the moon and back". John said he adored her and that she made him feel loved and pushed him to be a better person. John was with Maria when she passed away. Joe and I are comforted that she was not alone and yet we are broken hearted to know what he experienced and the pain he is feeling. He is getting the care he needs and we ask that you hold him in your heart with prayers and compassion just as you are doing for us and one another.

All of us present today and those of you watching the webcast know someone struggling with mental health. You yourself may be struggling. My hope and prayer is that all who are struggling with their mental health seek support and know that they are worthy of love, connection and compassion.

Each of us have to do our own work. We need a strong tool box and we need to not let down our guard. That being said, no one can get through this alone. As humans we need connection. We need love and compassion.

I last saw Maria at the beginning of August. We spent a couple days working to get her more settled in her studio apartment, assembling IKEA which furniture was way more fun than I had expected, and just hanging out. When it was time for me to leave, I didn't want to go. She hugged me, thanked me for being there and lovingly said, "I don't want you to go either". I'll hold the memory and feeling of that embrace with me for as long as I can.

We are devastated and heartbroken. We will not get over this unimaginable loss but we will get through it one day at a time with the love and support of our friends and family and all those that knew Maria.

We are and will be eternally grateful for all of your love and

compassion. I am blessed to have met many wise people on this journey and I think there have been many angels guiding me over the past several months to be better prepared for this loss. I believe Maria is filled with happiness and peace. I believe that she feels the love that we have for her and that she will always be close by sharing her love and energy with us. I truly believe that every aspect of Maria's life is valuable and hope that over time we find a deeper understanding of how she made a difference. I've found some peace and comfort these past few days watching the sunrise. I hope that you too will think of her when you see the sunrise and keep her light forever in your heart.
