Mark Steven Feit, a beloved husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, baby brother, and friend, passed away peacefully on August 15, 2024, at the age of 77. Born on June 9, 1947, in his treasured Brooklyn to Gertrude & Louis Feit, Mark was a proud New Yorker through and through. He never passed up the opportunity to talk baseball, bargains, bagels, or Brooklyn. He attended high school in Jersey and university in New Hampshire, where he played collegiate basketball. He moved to Georgia in 1996 and assimilated as best he could with his Northerner accent.

Mark's remarkable 40-year career in the food service industry included everything from designing commercial kitchens, purchasing & sales, to reviving failed restaurants, and managing major food warehouses & logistics.
