



Mrs. Mary Eleanor Slocum Behan

January 6, 1921 - August 10, 2015

Mary Eleanor Slocum Behan, a fiercely independent woman who had a knack for bringing out the best in others, died August 10, 2015 from complications of multiple myeloma. She was 94.

Though she was born and raised on a family farm in Baring, MO, she was destined for the big city. After a move to Kirksville as a teenager, she attended business school, and then set off for Washington, D. C. to support the war effort as a stenographer in the office of the Surgeon General.

She met her future husband, Francis James Behan, on a streetcar, and they were married on April 21, 1945. Their life together included raising five children in northern Virginia; spending six years in Brussels, Belgium, which allowed her to tour Europe; and taking trips with family and friends. She spent many winters in New Smyrna Beach, FL.

Her home was filled with mementos of her travels – including a collection of decorative spoons – and a never-ending supply of homemade chocolate chip cookies and banana bread. And while she never did reveal the secret to living into her 90s, her positive outlook on life and insistence on doing things herself marked her time on this earth until the end.

Mrs. Behan was preceded in death by her husband, and her son, Douglas. She is survived by her four sons, Robert and wife, Linda, of Roswell, GA, Thomas and wife, Helen, of Fairbanks, AK, Dennis and wife, Ronda, of Pendleton, OR, and Barry and wife, Gwen, of Haymarket, VA; daughter-in-law, Charlotte, of Fairbanks, AK; nephew, Joseph Bolcar and wife, Gail, of

Henderson, NC; five grandchildren, Erin Behan, of Santa Monica, CA, Rebecca Behan, of Brooklyn, NY, Rachel Barnes, of Williamsburg, VA, Bryan and Kevin Behan, both of Haymarket, VA; three great-grandchildren, Devin, Reagan, and Owen.

Her remains will be laid to rest alongside her husband's at Arlington National Cemetery.
