January 3, 1953 - January 16, 2023

Myron Engebretson, age 70, of Sandy Springs, GA passed away on January 16, 2023.

Myron received a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Minnesota Morris and a Master's Degree from the University of Minnesota. In 2010, he was inducted into the Minnesota Morris Football Hall of Fame and was a Minnesota State champion arm wrestler. After college, he was a lifelong salesman and entrepreneur. He met his wife Maureen while attending the University of Minnesota. They moved to Chicago where they adopted two children before moving to Atlanta in 1989 where he lived until his death. He attended the Catholic Church of St. Ann in Marietta.

Myron is survived by Maureen Leary; his daughter, Sarah Carzoli (Michael); his son, Erik Engebretson (Lauren); and his grandchildren, Eadlyn, Carter, Emry, and Charlotte

A memorial mass honoring Myron's life will be held on Thursday, January 26, 2023 at 2:00pm at the Catholic Church of St. Ann.

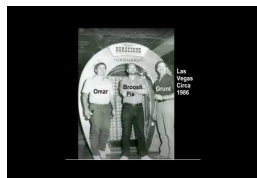
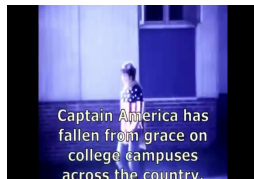

“ Let me offer my sincere condolences to the family of Myron. It was with shock and sadness that I learned of his passing. I knew he was having health issues but I was not aware how serious they were. I met Myron in 1971 when we were both incoming freshman at the University of Minnesota at Morris, MN. We were on the same floor in the dormitory. We made a lot of friends that year and several of the guys from that floor ended up pledging Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternity. Three of those chaps ended up sharing a room together in the fraternity house: Myron, Mark and myself. Myron was known as Grunt and the other fellow, Mark, was known as Omar. I do not know how either of them came by their nicknames. I was the third chap and was nicknamed Broosh Pie.

We had the largest room in the house, the only one able to handle 3 occupants. It was known as "3rd Floor Lounge" and because of it's size, it was often host to extra visitors and such. Myron supplied the stereo and the music. He was partial to Bachman Turner Overdrive, Harry Nilsson, Grand Funk Railroad and Led Zeppelin, to name a few. I still think of him when I hear those groups.

I am posting a few links to some videos. They are photos and old 8mm films that have been transferred into a digital format. The quality of the film has degraded over the years as they are now 50 years old but they are still quite watchable. We made some of the films for credit for a political science class. Myron was the star but anyone who happened to be nearby would often be pressed into service to play an extra or an important bit part. Omar has a part as well. He plays the Sheriff. You can tell that these films were definitely low budget and when I say low budget , I mean ZERO, save for the cost of the film.

There is also one video which showcases the fraternity house and related activities. Myron is not featured but he is in several of the pictures. Also one picture from the 1980's when the three of us met in Las Vegas.
