Nancy Wagstaff Milam age 83 of Roswell, GA. passed away peacefully at home with her daughter by her side on January 8, 2021. Nancy was a member of St. David's Episcopal Church in Roswell, GA. Nancy graduated from Washington and Lee High School in Arlington, VA. in 1955 and the University of Alabama in 1959 with a degree in Business and was a member of Delta Gamma Sorority. After graduating from The University of Alabama she began working for Congressman Hale Boggs in Washington, DC. She eventually joined the Foreign Service and was stationed in Thailand and Hong Kong as a secretary for the CIA. She completed her service overseas and moved back to the United States.

In 1976, she moved to Tampa, FL and worked as a paralegal for the Hillsborough County Attorney's office until she retired.

During her time in Tampa, she volunteered for 5 years as a Guardian ad Litem where she was acknowledged as Guardian of the Year for her stellar dedication and commitment to children in foster care. She was an avid reader, gardener and international traveler throughout her life.

After her retirement she moved to Roswell, GA to be closer to her grandchildren. She became known and loved by everyone as Grancy. She was preceded in death by her son, Perry Edward Milam. She is survived by her daughter, Suzanne Milam Clark, son in law Michael Anthony Clark and her grandchildren Cameron Perry Clark (age 15) and Cecilia Michelle Clark (age 13).
