I used to watch him on Television where he would compete against other High Schools in Brookfield Connecticut. He was fascinated with Asia, so when I came back from Japan, I would say to him later in life “Domo Arrigato Gozaimus Baby” from a rock song, which means Thank you in Japanese, he would smile slightly. He was taken from us long before his time by a tragic accident, but lived much longer due to the dedication of his loving parents who cared for him at home on a daily basis. I remember taking him as a former Marine to the Scotia Rifle Range in State College Pa, Penn State. All the men in town went there to shoot, practice, and get ready for hunting season. I taught him how to shoot a rifle, his brother mark accompanied us. He was calm, slow and deliberate. He was fascinated by the experience. Neil 3 as we knew him is now in a much better place, surrounded by love and the souls of those who loved him, and knew him here on this planet.
