



Philip Loyd Reagan

March 19, 1921 - August 8, 2012

Philip L. Reagan , 91 years old, died after a short illness. He lived in Alpharetta, Ga, and is survived by Lucille, is wife of 21 years. His first wife of 46 years preceded him in 1990. He was a member of St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church in Alpharetta.

Born in Kansas City, MO., he grew up in various locations as his father was transferred. Phil was educated at the Baylor School in Chattanooga from which he graduated in 1939. At the University of Georgia in Athens, where he was a member of Kappa Alpha social fraternity, his education was interrupted after three years by World War II. He completed his college work at the University of Rochester, Rochester, NY, graduating in 1948.

Phil was a life-long aviation enthusiast, entering the Army Air Corps in 1942 as an aviation cadet. His Air Force career was spent mostly as an instructor of aircraft armament and gunnery, serving in both World War II and the Korean War, attaining the rank of First Lieutenant.

Phil lived for 34 years in Babylon, Long Island, NY, employed in New York City until 1983 when he retired as a vice president of Consolidated Cigar Corp., the world's largest manufacturer of cigars. He was director of purchasing and additionally was in charge of three cigar box manufacturing factories in the US and the Caribbean. He was credited with adopting many new manufacturing

procedures during his tenure.

Phil enjoyed golf which he played for over 65 years as well as Gin Rummy and Bridge. He was an 18 year member of Southward Ho Country Club in Bay Shore, NY. He retired to Ft Myers, FI in 1983 where he was a member of Sable Springs Country Club. In 2000 he moved to Alpharetta to be near the family.

In addition to Lucille, he is survived by his daughter Meg Danielson (Robert), her family of Long Island, NY, 3 grandchildren, 6 stepsons and their families, 12 step grandchildren and their families and 7 step great grandchildren.
