Randall Joseph McAuley passed away suddenly due to natural causes on Dec.29, 2024 in Atlanta, GA. Randy was born in Pittsburgh, PA on Jan. 30,1962 to the late Bernard Joseph McAuley and Judith McAuley. He is survived by his sister Amy Kerns (Kelly), brother Douglas (Fran), sister Kathleen Gaus (Jeff), 8 nieces and nephews, 2 Aunts, and 9 cousins. All of whom were a big part of his life.

Randy grew up in Pittsburgh, PA where he attended Mount Lebanon High School, graduating in 1980 and took pride in establishing enduring and lifelong friendships with his high school classmates. other organizers who became lifelong friends.

In addition to his volunteer work and day jobs, he spent weekends at a friend's place he referred to as "the farm" where he spent many happy hours with friends enjoying life. Randy was a lifelong and passionate fan of the Pittsburgh Steelers. His other interests included photography and fishing. He will be forever remembered for his renowned use of flip phones.

He will be missed by family, longtime friends and passionate volunteers he worked with throughout the years.

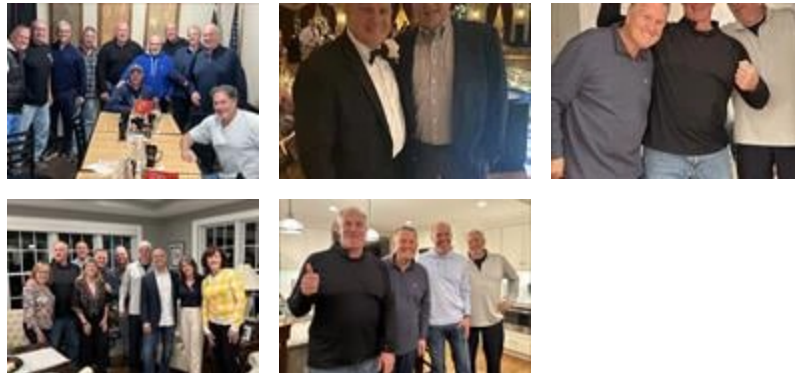
