Sally Hoyt Jones, 80, a resident of Roswell, died peacefully in the company of loved ones on Monday, May 16th, 2022.

She was born July 20, 1941, in San Diego, California to William Wellington Hoyt and Rosemary Cathryne O'Bryan Hoyt. Through Sally's years working as a teacher in both Michigan and Georgia she combined her deep knowledge of mathematics and her dedication to the art of teaching providing her students with the optimal learning experience. Those who are fortunate enough to have known Sally can attest to her genuine interest and her active engagement in the lives of those she loved. She was preceded in death by her mother and father; sister Annette C. Hoyt; and husband and love of her life Samuel Paul Jones.

“ *From April 19th, Sally’s last phone call to me, through Katia’s thoughtful call to me May 4th, to Dave’s notice May 12th that Sally was now in hospice, through May 16th, Dave’s notice that Sally had died, my heart kept solemn vigil, until that final news, at which I was inexplicably seized with JOY and played repeatedly the Te Deum, the Gregorian chant form, that glorious hymn of Thanksgiving to God, the Giver of All Good, reputed to have been composed by St Ambrose for the Baptism of St Augustine, and sung through church history for great occasions in every monastery and convent worthy of the name—Sally sees God! Thank you, each beloved member of her family—I watched the livestreamed Mass, met and received each one in my heart, particularly Karl, who had even in the last months obtained that special chair/bed that gave her such comfort, and who so beautifully, nobly, and bravely gave the family’s honoring of their Mother, sister, friend.*
