August 15, 1941 - March 22, 2017

Sandra Clark Piner of Atlanta, Georgia, passed away on Wednesday, March 22,

2017, at Elmcroft of Roswell Senior Living in Roswell, Georgia.

The daughter of Beatrice and Wilbur H. Clark, Sr., Sandie was born in Burlington,

Vermont on August 15, 1941. She graduated from Burlington High School in 1959.

The first in her family to attend college, she graduated from the University of Vermont in 1964 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Medical Technology.

She

worked at the Mary Fletcher Hospital for several years before moving to Connecticut. She returned to Vermont in the early 70's to pursue further education.

During this time she also taught in the UVM undergraduate Medical Technology program.

Sandie moved to Germany in the early 1970's, with her husband, who was stationed there as a member of the U.S. Army. Following the end of their marriage,

she remained in Germany for several years as a civilian Forensic Chemist with the

U.S. Army Crime Laboratory. Upon closure of U.S. military bases throughout

Europe in the 1990's, she returned to the States in 1995 and spent the last 22 years as a resident of Atlanta, Georgia. She retired from government service in 2006.

Sandie's parents and sister Iris Johnson predecease her. She is survived by her brothers Wilbur H. Clark, Jr. (wife Edith) of South Burlington, Vermont and David D.

Clark of Burlington, Vermont. She is also survived by her 3 nieces and their families,

Cheri Garrison and husband, Richard; Melissa Russell and husband, Eric; Krista

Clark and husband, Michael Jones, all residing in Atlanta, Georgia. In addition she

leaves behind 2 grandnieces and 2 grand nephews, Zoey and Ezra Garrison and

Cimone and Caden Russell.

Sandie touched the hearts of people in special ways, leaving many dear friends

who rallied round and visited with her throughout the final months of her time with

us. We are extremely grateful for their dedication and commitment, and for the prayers of so many others.
