Stanley Charles Wentworth, Jr., 94, died on Friday, February 8th, in Marietta, Georgia. He was a World War II Navy veteran and a long-time employee of ARKLA Gas Company. He was a Mason and a member of Rotary Club. He was born May 25, 1918, in Kingsville, Texas, the eldest son of the late Stanley Charles Wentworth, Sr., and Vida Willie Dennis. 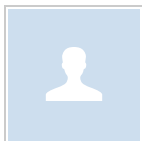
