June 29, 1943 - September 9, 2017

Susan Fuller Wolling, “Susu”, age 74, passed away peacefully in her Milton, GA home on the morning of Saturday, September 9th after a 4-year battle with both lung and pancreatic cancer. She was surrounded by family and ministry at the time of passing. Her oncologist called her a “Miracle” patient for surviving the first round of pancreatic cancer with her strong personality, her will to live and her goal of seeing her oldest granddaughter Victoria “Tori’s” 2016 Milton High School graduation. She loved her family with all of her heart.

Susan was born June 29, 1943, in Lexington, Kentucky. She grew up in Atlanta, GA and attended the first graduating class of Sandy Springs High School. She relocated to Savannah, GA, with her parents in 1961 when her father, William G. Fuller, Sr. opened Fuller Oldsmobile, Inc. a successful automotive dealership. While living in Savannah, she earned an associate’s degree in business, and became a mother to her only living child - Amy. She was a member of Wesley Monumental United Methodist Church as well as the Symphony Guild, Children’s Theatre and an active member in her community.

Susan eventually relocated back to Atlanta, GA when she married Sam Wolling. Although no longer married, Sam remains the true love of Susan’s life. She loved spending time with Sam and always looked forward to their weekly date nights on Thursday, Saturday and Sunday brunch at the IHOP. She also cared deeply for Sam’s family - his loving daughter Jenni Dewoody

and husband Matthew, granddaughters Jessica Dewoody Kuhn and Mandy of Austin, TX; as well as his son, Sam Wolling, Jr. of Los Angeles, CA.

Susan enjoyed gardening, birds and nature and was called the “flower lady” by her friends and family, who would often call on her for gardening advice. She was also an excellent cook, known for her great southern recipes! She was beautiful, fun and always a straight- shooter – ask for her opinion and she would give you an honest answer, like it or not. She loved golf (playing & watching on TV). As a former member of the Champions Club of Alpharetta, she wasn’t the best golfer but one afternoon she totally surprised herself and her foursome by getting a hole in one! She also enjoyed spending time with her many good friends at the Alpharetta Adult Activity Center. She was a member of the Alpharetta Golden Age Club and enjoyed working and volunteering in the ceramics workshop until this past summer when her cancer returned. She attended Birmingham United Methodist Church as a guest with her daughter and family over the years.

She will be greatly missed by her heart broken daughter, Amy Moss and her favorite Son in Law, Colin Moss, and the lights of her life – granddaughters, Victoria Johnson and Sophia Moss. She is also survived by her best friend & brother William G. Fuller, Jr. “BG” and her loving sister-in-law, Joy Fuller, of Savannah, Ga.; her loving nieces, Jill, Ned and Caroline Joy Woolfolk of St. Augustine, FL, Kristan and Nick Constantine and their daughter Mary Grace of Savannah, GA; and her nephew, Gaines Fuller Jonakin and Lori Jonakin and their daughter Zoie of Austin, TX.
