Mrs. Suzanne "Suzy" Pink May, age 73, of Flowery Branch, GA passed away Sunday, October 9, 2022. Suzy was born on July 6, 1949 in Queens, New York, the daughter of the late Hans and Ann Pink.

Suzy loved to cook. She picked up some favorite dishes from her mother but also took professional cooking classes. She was especially well known for her rum cakes.

Suzy had a knack for connecting with people, and she touched many lives with her quick wit and humor. She knew how to pool resources and was always trying to help others. Her influence will forever remain in the lives of her family, close friends and even the doctors who treated her in later years. Through many serious health issues, Suzy persevered and was described by

many as “determined” and “tough.” Despite all her medical challenges, she set her heart and mind to be baptized as one of Jehovah’s Witnesses, and did so in 2012. She became very close with her local Gainesville, GA congregation, devoting as much time as she could in service to her loving God Jehovah. In addition to her parents, Suzy is preceded in death by her second husband, Bill Johnston.
