Suzanne Sammons Tefft of Alpharetta, GA died January 27, 2020. She was born May 1, 1933 in Parkersburg, WV and was preceded in death by her loving husband, Col. Howard E. Tefft, USAF (Ret), her parents, Herbert Wooten Sammons and Louise Lambert Sammons, her three brothers, Herbert Wooten Sammons, Jr., John Lambert Sammons, and Harry Camel Sammons. She attended De Sales Heights Academy where she was an accomplished pianist, graduated from Parkersburg High School, and earned an Associate Degree from Ohio University. She was a registered medical technologist, having worked in the Hematology Lab at Emory University Hospital and a local private laboratory in the Atlanta area. She was also a licensed real estate agent in the state of Georgia.
