



## Mr. Thomas L. Elliott

March 9, 1937 - April 10, 2020

Colonel Thomas (Tom) Elliott died at the age of 83 on Good Friday, April 10, 2020 at the Georgian Lakeside Assisted Living in Roswell, Georgia. He was a highly decorated veteran of the Vietnam war. Tom was a charismatic leader who inspired the highest standards in every endeavor during his life. He possessed a relaxed manner, keen insight and quick wit, qualities admired by his many life-long friends and family. Despite his many achievements, Tom remained a humble, generous and engaging friend throughout his life.

Tom was born March 9, 1937 in Bristol, VA to John and Bertha Elliott. He was married to Peggy Anne Clawson on August 10, 1958. They were happily married for more than 62 years.

Tom graduated from East Tennessee State College in August 1959 as a Distinguished Military Graduate. His first assignment in the United States Army was at Ft. Benning, GA as a Second Lieutenant in the Infantry. After two years of Infantry service, he branch transferred to the Military Police Corps. Following 30 years of distinguished service, Tom retired as a Criminal Investigation Command Brigade Commander at Ft Meade, MD. He had combat tours in Vietnam and Thailand and served 3 years in Panama. He had several stateside assignments which included Ft. Gordon, GA, Ft Myer, VA and a tour in the Pentagon. In 1976 he received a Master's degree in Public Administration from Jacksonville State University. Tom received numerous military decorations to include two Legion of Merit Medals, the Bronze Star Medal and three Army Commendation Medals.

After Tom's retirement from the military, he became the Business Manager for the Fulcher Hagler Law Firm, moved on to be the Vice President of Sizemore Security and finished his civilian career as the Business Manager for Richard Young Associates in Augusta, GA. Upon his retirement from his civilian career, he and Peggy moved to Roswell, Georgia to be near their son and his family. Tom always lead by example in everything he did. He was a soldier's soldier, a devoted husband, a superb father and a benevolent grandfather. He also led by example in his faith. He was a non-judgmental Christian and treated everyone as he would want to be treated.

He is survived by his wife, Peggy, his three sons, Pat and wife Phebe of Richmond, Virginia; Joe and wife Mollianne of Roswell, Georgia; David and wife Robin of Wayne, Pennsylvania; and his sister, Tonya Pickle of Amory, Mississippi. He considered his seven grandchildren to be one of life's greatest blessings. They are Kelly and Courtney (Pat's); Carlen, Harrison, Hill and Evans (Joe's); and Giles (David's). He was also blessed with three great grandchildren.

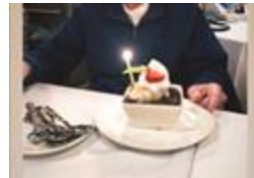
