February 5, 1920 - March 5, 2006

Mr. Warner Lyle Anderson, 86, having resided in the Atlanta, GA area for three years, died March 5, 2006. He was born in Minnesota to Gustof Adolph and Grace Teare Anderson and was raised in Waterloo, Iowa. He served in the Army in WWII and upon returning to Waterloo, became a design engineer working for the Chamberlain Corp. and designing products for Sears, Roebuck and Company. In 1961 he was transferred to Monroe, GA to start a new Chamberlain Corp. plant. He later was transferred to the plant in Albia, IA, where he resided until 2002. His wife, Jean Christensen Anderson, preceded him in death August 28, 2002. He is survived by his daughter and son-in-law, Cheryl and Rev. Donald E. Wagner of Woodstock, GA; son and daughter-in-law, Dr. Dennis and Anngrey Doig Anderson of Hopkinton, MA; sister, Ruby Eggers and brother, John Anderson both of Waterloo, IA; grandchildren, Kevin Wagner and wife Liz of Woodstock, GA, David Wagner and wife Susan of Cumming, GA, Timothy Lyle Anderson of Monroe, GA, Jeffrey Anderson of Hawaii and Adagray Doig Anderson of Hopkinton, MA; great grandchildren, Brittany Wagner, Justin Wagner, and William Jeffrey Pang. Memorial services will be held in the chapel of Northside Chapel Funeral Directors and Crematory, Roswell, GA on Sunday March 12, at 4 p.m. Interment will be in Cherokee National Cemetery, Canton, GA at a later date.

I also wanted to let everyone know that there will also be a military service included with the memorial service on Sunday March 12th. The army will provide a 7 man team to perform a 21 gun salute outside the chapel as the flag is held high, and also there will be the playing of the bugle, folding of the flag, and presenting the flag to the family. This was originally going to be done at the national military cemetery (Cherokee National Cemetery newly opening in the last of April) where Dad and Mom will be laid to rest, but they called me a day ago and changed the location. I believe Dad would be most delighted with the military service. He had just completed getting his 10 medals from WWII which took us many months to accomplish. His records were burned up in the fire in St. Louis so he always said it took him 60 years to get the medals.

We would like to express our sincere sympathies to you and your family in your loss.

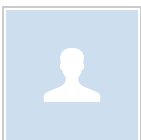

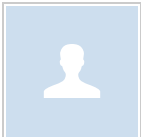
