Bill was a man of strong faith, believing in the power and strength of Jesus Christ’s love and the beauty and peace that would await him after his passing.

Bill always lived by the motto “Do what’s right and do what’s good. Be kind and help others”.

Bill is survived by his wife Deb; children Brooke (Tom) and Morgan (Matt);

grandchildren William, Wesley, and McKenna; sister Beth and brothers Walker and David; and father-in-law Howard.
